- ❖ Successful coordination and execution of missions across various fellowships.

CHALLENGES EXPERIENCED

- ❖ Financial limitations affecting proper ministry representation during the fellowship's missions.
- ❖ Not fully supporting the fellowship's financially as the ministry despite of requisition from them
- ❖ Short preparation timelines in some mission engagements.
- ❖ Limited availability of human resource personnel in specific departments.
- ❖ Some fellowships recording low number of missionaries due to lack of resources to help missionaries reach the mission ground.
- ❖ Inadequate mission equipment and outreach materials.

Despite these challenges, the grace of God sustained the ministry and enabled successful completion of planned activities.

UPCOMING MINISTRY'S BIENIAL DECEMBER 2026 MISSION
